## • BGSD needs your opinion on the 2026/27 school calendar.

The Board of Trustees is asking for your input on two possible Draft versions of the 2026 - 2027 school year calendar.

Each year, Labour Day falls on different days in September. In September 2026, Labour Day falls on September 7th and as such makes it almost impossible to start the school year after that date and still meet the requisite number of instructional hours into the first semester.

The Fall Break was originally inserted into the calendar a few years ago for mental health reasons. It is a means of providing students and staff with an opportunity to rest and refocus as the time change brings us into the long winter months with shorter days. It was also intended to be a good break as it is in the middle of flu season and it would allow both students and teachers the opportunity to experience or recover from illness without missing too much valuable school time. It balances the spring break that begins the last week of March.

The difference between a 3 day Fall Break (Draft A) and a full week Fall Break (Draft B) is the start of the school year.
